When an inmate asks to speak to me, I walk down to his room and he asks for a Bible, I began to ask him about his salvation, he told me he had been saved . I ask him when? This is what he said. "Chaplain Brown when you were on the hallway on the fourteenth floor I heard you talking to someone else, and that's when I ask Jesus to come into my heart." Why did you not let me know sooner? I ask him! He then said "I wrote my mom and told her." Glory!! I wonder how many more have written home, that only **HE** knows about!! It was also a sad time for me, I had to tell an inmate his grandmother past away. Then to hear him cry what a very difficult time this was for me as for him.

As with any ministry there are times of sadness and gladness. It can be very rewarding in knowing I was able to minister in helping of the salvation of the soul, moreover bring comfort to a soul.
