GREETINGS: I was reading from the book of Joshua Chapter 2 verse 14. These words spoke to my heart... "Our Life for your's".... I wonder how many of us as Christians would be willing to say this. Is this not what God the Father did through His son the Lord Jesus Christ? How many of us would be willing to do this? This should be the desire of every Born again Believer. "Our Life for Your's" The Lord reminded me, when I read this of what He did for me. That is how I can go to the prison and tell other's.

During October, the Lord truly blessed there was Five precious souls saved. One particular, he is nineteen years old. He had put in a request form to speak to a chaplain. Upon his arrival, I began to talk to him about his problem. He made this statement "Chaplain Brown I need some help, this is my second time around and I do not want it to be a third." Can you help me?" I told him I could not but I new one that can! This is when I began to share John 3:16. The tears began to flow. To summarize what took place he ask the Lord to forgive him and save him. I want you to understand he began praying and said something like this; Lord Jesus, would you, Help me! I need your help. The presence's of the Lord was so real. Since that day, I have talk to him and he has yet to mention the problem that brought us together. Why! His burdens have been lifted at Calvary! Last of October, I was at Southern Correctional Institution Troy, NC. What a great time of fellowship with other missionaries and volunteers I had. The last night of the revival, there were 97 inmates in the service. In all twenty-three professions of faith was made, while at this prison. The Lord truly Blessed!

Then the first week in November, a volunteer from my home church and I went to Mountain View Correctional, Spruce Pine NC. This was his first time ever going to a prison, he told me I was Paul and he was Timothy. It was a great time in the Lord to be able to fellowship and to see how the Lord used him while ministering to others. There were eight professions of faith while at this prison. I dealt with one man who came forward at the invitation. He told me he would like to be saved, then he said these words "But I cannot read." My heart was broken nevertheless; I told him that it did not matter to the Lord. It took extra time with him in showing him and reading the scripture to him. (*I wonder how many are letting pride stand in their way of coming forward?*) This man asks the Lord to forgive him. The next time I saw him he thanked me, and said, he slept the best he had ever had. While at this prison, an inmate came to me and told me, that when I had talked to him before he was not a Christian, but he was now. It had been a year since I had talked to him. He remembered me, and wanted me to know what had taken place in his life. The Lord knows how to encourage you when you need it the most.

I do need to take the rest of your time. To ask you please pray for my family. Some are already aware of the things that have been happening. As brief as possible, our son Adam has finally found the problem concerning him breaking out with red welts. The Allergist Specialist found he is allergic to peanuts. Then our daughter Carissa she has been suffering from severe migraines. The headaches at one point were so bad her temples had swollen, and she could not stand for you to touch her forehead. After going and getting a CAT scan and then a MRI, the neurologist has yet to determine why. Please Pray!
